



What is a general session?

General sessions are large group courses open to all registered conference attendees. Seating is first come, first served, so come early to get a good seat. No additional registration is needed to attend any of the general sessions.

What is a workshop?




Workshops are small group courses with hands-on elements.
Workshops are ticketed and required additional registration for a nominal fee. If you are more than 15 minutes late to a workshop, you will not be allowed in.

What if I am late to a course?

- In an effort to keep the conference program on schedule, courses start promptly. Be early!
- If you are late to a general session, try to enter the room as quietly as possible and find a seat.

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
