

CONFERENCE

What is a general session?

General sessions are large group courses open to all registered conference attendees. Seating is first come, first served, so come early to get a good seat. No additional registration is needed to attend any of the general sessions.

What is a workshop?

Workshops are small group courses with hands-on elements. Workshops are ticketed and required additional registration for a nominal fee. If you are more than 15 minutes late to a workshop, you will not be allowed in.

What if I am late to a course?

- In an effort to keep the conference program on schedule, courses start promptly. Be early!
- U If you are late to a general session, try to enter the room as quietly as possible and find a seat.
- If you are late to a workshop, you may lose your seat! Workshops are always in high demand and often sell out prior to the event. On-site wait-lists are used to fill empty seats. If you are late, your seat will likely be filled.
- If you miss a workshop, you can choose to attend another workshop that is not already sold out. Check in with registration on-site to work out your specific situation. Please note: Refunds will NOT be issued on missed workshops.

Will there be course handouts?

- General sessions will have handouts provided online approximately 30 days before the event. All preregistered attendees will be sent an email notice that the handouts are ready to be printed and downloaded.
- Workshop materials are all provided by the presenter and handed out during the session.



CE CREDITS

How many credits can I expect to earn while attending UOR?

- You can earn up to 20 CE credits by attending general sessions in every time slot on all three days. This includes attendance at the mega, keynote, and wrap-up sessions.
- Organize your time to fit your needs. The number of CE credits available is indicated on each course. You can maximize your time to earn as many credits as possible—or earn what you need.

How do I collect my CE credits?

There is a CE kiosk on-site where you can collect your CE certifications of completion and verification. To do this, follow these instructions: At the end of every session you will be given a CE code. Write down the code and visit the CE kiosk when convenient. At the kiosk, log in, take the course evaluation, and print your CE verification. The CE kiosk will be open all three days of the event. CE redemptions may also be done later from home. Customer service support is available onsite and by phone or email, if needed.

The World Health Organization recognizes Odontophobia, the fear of going to the dentist, as a disease that affects the population and can be detrimental to overall health. The three classes of Odontophobia range from mild to severe, integrating Dental Fear and Anxiety (DFA). Further studies indicate the development of DFA has an increased prevalence between seven and nine years old. DFA can affect anyone, but children are particularly susceptible. DFA can lead to severe repercussions to one's oral health and is considered a significant barrier to receiving dental care. It can start with avoiding essential dental care, which leads to the deterioration of oral health. The neglect of oral care may lead to pain and the patient knowing extensive treatment is needed. Feelings of guilt, shame, fear, and anxiety arise, which continues the damaging cycle. Multiple factors may affect DFA, such as age, socioeconomic status, culture, siblings, clinical environment, dental procedures, parental/maternal anxiety, and dental visit experiences. This course will emphasize non-pharmacological behavior guidance techniques and appointment recommendations to help build positive pediatric patient visits to alleviate anxiety.





A Mouthful: Differential Diagnosis for Periodontal Pathologies

There is no other topic that interests and complexes the dental professional more than oral pathology. When examining a patient with non-plaque induced gingivitis, we must pay attention to clinical signs of erythema, edema, pain, heat, loss of function, swelling in the gingival margin, blunting of the papilla, bleeding, and discomfort upon probing. The complexity of these cases allows for a great margin of error and calls for key players with knowledge of oral anatomy and physiology. Dental professionals hold a unique understanding of the oral cavity that enables us to establish differential diagnoses, treatment plans, and referrals. As key oral care providers we need to see beyond our scope and take all these factors into account when determining a differential diagnosis. A better understanding of periodontal pathologies enables us to better manage lesions and assist in decreasing recurrence.

Gingival enlargement is one of the frequent features of gingival disease. It could be associated with the presence or absence of plaque-biofilm or not,. Due to the variety of presentations, diagnosing the array of pathologies associated with gingival hyperplasia could become challenging for the dental team. For this analysis, clinical manifestations of gingival enlargements are focused only on those not induced by the presence of plaque. It is important to note that typical plaque control is not the recommended treatment in these cases. The importance of a correct decision tree to classify these pathologies is vital to narrow the differential diagnoses.

This course will guide the practitioner in using a decision tree to assist in determining a differential diagnosis for periodontal pathologies. This interactive course takes participants through a variety of case studies allowing the dental professional to experience real life scenarios to better equip them for clinical practice.






