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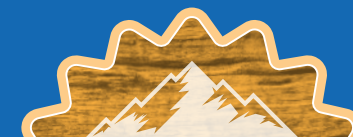

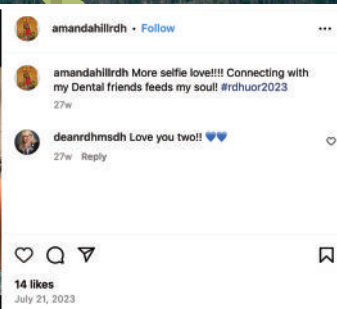

CONFERENCE

What is a general session?

- General sessions are large group courses open to all registered conference attendees. Seating is first come, first served, so come early to get a good seat. No additional registration is needed to attend any of the general sessions.

What is a workshop?

- Workshops are small group courses with hands-on elements. Workshops are ticketed and required additional registration for a nominal fee. If you are more than 15 minutes late to a workshop, you will not be allowed in.

What if I am late to a course?

- In an effort to keep the conference program on schedule, courses start promptly. Be early!
- If you are late to a general session, try to enter the room as quietly as possible and find a seat.
- If you are late to a workshop, you may lose your seat! Workshops are always in high demand and often sell out prior to the event. On-site wait-lists are used to fill empty seats. If you are late, your seat will likely be filled.
- If you miss a workshop, you can choose to attend another workshop that is not already sold out. Check in with registration on-site to work out your specific situation. Please note: Refunds will NOT be issued on missed workshops.

Will there be course handouts?

- General sessions will have handouts provided online approximately 30 days before the event. All preregistered attendees will be sent an email notice that the handouts are ready to be printed and downloaded.
- Workshop materials are all provided by the presenter and handed out during the session.

GENERAL EVENT

How many credits can I expect to earn while attending UOR?

How do I collect my CE credits?

To do this, follow these instructions: At the end of every session you will be given a CE code. Write down the code and visit the CE kiosk when convenient. At the kiosk, log in, take the course evaluation, and print your CE verification. The CE kiosk will be open all three days of the event. CE redemptions may also be done later from home. Customer service support is available onsite and by phone or email, if needed.

In Plain Sight: Confronting the Human Trafficking Crisis is the Dental Setting

- Identify local and national resources for trafficked persons.

Human trafficking is a rapidly increasing public health and safety issue in the United States. It is the fastest rising commerce in the world with over 200,000 minors at risk in the United States. People are forced into labor or sexual exploitation with deception and intimidation. It is reported that up to 80% of victims are seen by a healthcare provider while captive. Often, victims will not identify themselves as such due to the fear of being further abused by their captor. Dental care providers are perfectly positioned to identify the signs and report suspected human trafficking. By educating dental clinicians, victims of trafficking may be more likely to be rescued and receive the appropriate resources for recovery. This course will define types of trafficking, differentiate between sex trafficking and sex work, identify at-risk populations, describe how to identify and report trafficked patients, and discuss trauma-informed care. In 2018, the operators of the National Human Trafficking Hotline, The Polaris Project, reported that out of the over 45,000 calls that came into the hotline, only .2% of the suspected trafficked individuals were rescued. Of those, less than 1% will recover from the trauma. With the large number of trafficked persons being seen in healthcare while captive, this statistic shows that health providers are under-recognizing and under-reporting. The training of every dental professional in the United States would increase the number of vigilant professionals by over 600,000. This life-saving course could be the gateway to freedom from modern-day slavery for many. This course is approved by the Texas Health and Human Services Commission in accordance with House Bill 2059, 86th Session, 2019. Texas and Michigan attendees will meet state licensure requirements for renewal by completing this course.

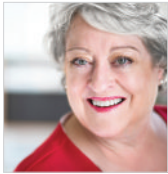

People with Intellectual and developmental disabilities (I/DD) are less likely to have regular dental care due to the limited number of dental professionals who are trained to provide care to this population. With 7.39 million people in the United States who have an I/DD, the need has never been greater to become educated on how to provide dental care for this vulnerable population. Most dental providers have had little to any training in school on best practices for taking care of this population and therefore do not feel comfortable caring for them. Traditional dental offices are not set up to accommodate someone with special needs making visits stressful for everyone. Compared to the general population, people in the I/DD population experience more chronic disease at an earlier age as well as oral health issues at a much higher rate. In addition to the lack of trained dental providers, there are a multitude of other barriers that contribute to dental access issues for the I/DD population. In addition to training dental professionals on best practices for caring for this population, providing care where the I/DD population live and decreasing other barriers, will help to bring much needed dental care to them. This can be accomplished with the help of dentistry.

According to the DEA, cannabis is considered to have no accepted medical use and, thus, it is illegal to possess. Yet, almost every state has enacted legislation aimed at legalizing or decriminalizing cannabis for medical or recreational use. Despite this rise in social and legal acceptance, public health concerns regarding the use of cannabis remain, especially among dental hygienists, since the major routes of administration of cannabis involve the oral cavity. This program will introduce dental hygienists to the pharmacology of cannabis, including its various dosage forms, routes of administration, and adverse effects. Special emphasis will be placed on the effects of cannabis use on oral health and dental hygiene treatment, as well as the potential use of cannabis chairside for the management of patient anxiety and odontogenic pain.

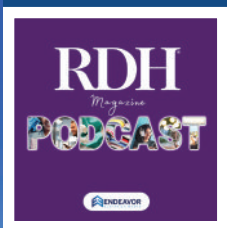

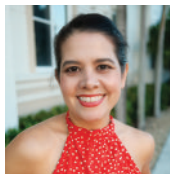

The lips are a delicate and expressive part of the face but are susceptible to various pathologies. Some of these pathologies are relatively harmless, others can be more serious, and others may be a consequence of our vanity. Lips are part of the extraoral clinical examination but, in many cases, are overlooked. Dental hygienists can help detect abnormalities on the lips early and help prevent more severe health problems. By discussing preventive care for chapped lips, sunburn, melanotic macules, or lesions caused by the Herpes Simplex Virus, dental hygienists can teach patients how to protect their lips while improving the diagnosis and treatment of different lip problems and determine when a referral to other healthcare providers may be necessary.

Dental hygienists often encounter common lip pathologies such as angular cheilitis or cold sores. But how about those lip pathologies that can be more serious? Lip pathologies can be a nuisance and a sign of a more severe underlying condition. Actinic cheilitis, melanoma of the lips, and even the Tyndall effect caused by lip fillers are some challenges we must understand to establish a better differential diagnosis and care for our patients. Since lip lesions can be caused by a variety of factors, including infection, inflammation, and trauma, this course will guide the practitioner in using a decision tree to assist in determining a differential diagnosis for lip pathologies by taking the participants through various case studies allowing the dental professional to experience real-life scenarios to equip them for better clinical practice.

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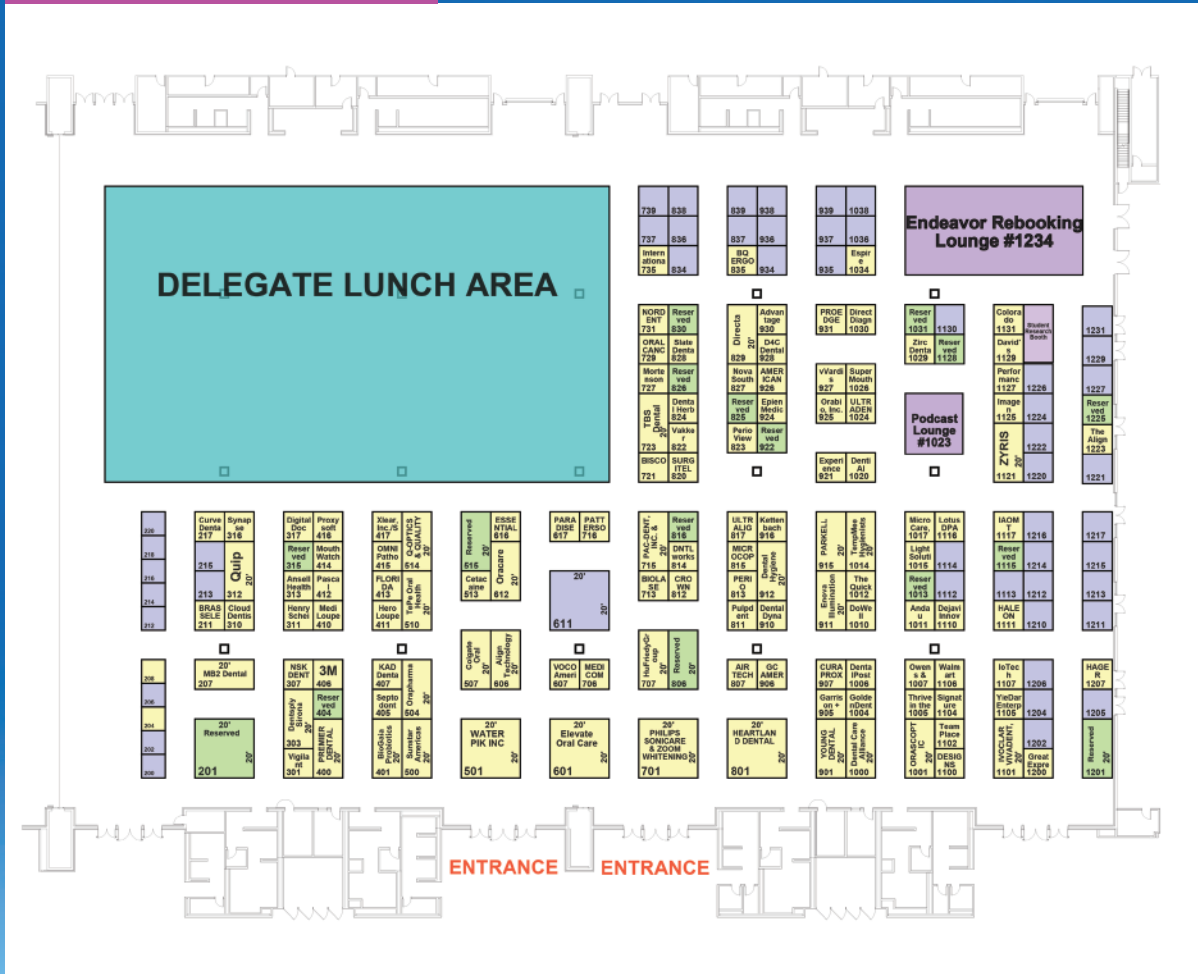

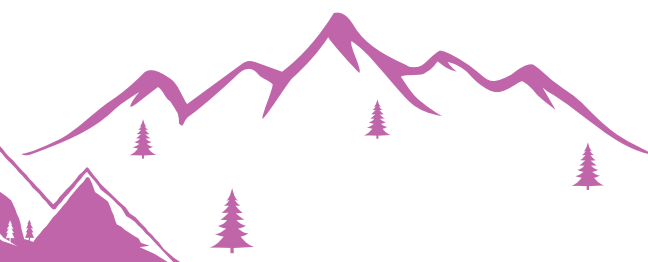

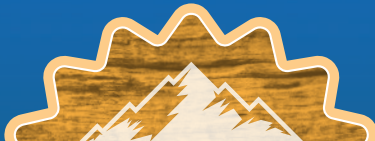
