### CONFERENCE

#### What is a general session?

General sessions are large group courses open to all registered conference attendees. Seating is first come, first served, so come early to get a good seat. No additional registration is needed to attend any of the general sessions.

#### What is a workshop?

Workshops are small group courses with hands-on elements. Workshops are ticketed and required additional registration for a nominal fee. If you are more than 15 minutes late to a workshop, you will not be allowed in.

#### What if I am late to a course?

- In an effort to keep the conference program on schedule, courses start promptly. Be early!
- If you are late to a general session, try to enter the room as quietly as possible and find a seat.
- If you are late to a workshop, you may lose your seat! Workshops are always in high demand and often sell out prior to the event. On-site wait-lists are used to fill empty seats. If you are late, your seat will likely be filled.
- If you miss a workshop, you can choose to attend another workshop that is not already sold out. Check in with registration on-site to work out your specific situation. Please note: Refunds will NOT be issued on missed workshops.

Insulin Resistance and Diabetes: The relationship to Oral and Systemic Disease

#### **Objectives:**

- Understand the role cytokines play in diabetes and insulin resistance.
- Recognize the relationship between IR and diabetes related to oral health.
- Develop health history questions designed to recognize possible insulin resistance and related disorders.
- Create an education plan for patients to help them play an active role in addressing diabetes and insulin resistance as well as associated inflammatory diseases.

Insulin resistance (IR) is considered a chronic and low level inflammatory condition. It is closely related to altered glucose tolerance, abdominal obesity, and coronary heart disease. IR is accompanied by an increase in the inflammatory cytokines like interleukin-1 and 6, tumor necrosis factor-α, Levels of these cytokines also effect the progression of IR.

Periodontitis is the most common oral diseases. Pro-inflammatory cytokines are released in the disease process of periodontitis, including IL-1 and IL-6. Periodontitis can be attributed with exacerbation of IR. Data in the literature supports a "two-way relationship" between diabetes and periodontitis.

The co-existence of systemic and oral inflammatory diseases warrants closer examination by dental professionals. Appropriate health history questions and review is essential in helping patients maintain oral health.

There are many topics we discuss in our dental practice that do not come easily for individuals on our team. From bulimia to addiction, we encounter tough topics with which we struggle to have effective communication with our patients, and sometimes choose to avoid these topics altogether. For example, discussing the cause and effect relationship between sexual behaviors and oral cancer is not easy for anyone. However, since nearly every person who is sexually active will have an HPV infection in their lifetime, and since HPV is now the leading cause of oropharyngeal cancer, it has become a topic worth investigating and sharing with our patients.

In this course we will touch on the impact HPV has had on oropharyngeal cancer risk and shed light on how we can improve oral cancer detection in our practice. We will explore how to lead our team in building protocol for patient education that can be customized to fit the culture in our individual practices. We will discover methods to encourage involvement of the entire dental team by providing the tools necessary for effective HPV communication.

Working SMARTer: It is not just for kids. Going deeper with the many uses of silver diamine fluoride

Caries is the most common chronic childhood disease that is completely preventable. Traditional approaches of drill, fill, and oral hygiene instruction are not working. Telling parents, children, and caregivers to cut back on drinking sugared and acidic beverages as well as fermentable carbohydrates and to have better oral hygiene has not helped change the caries epidemic. Even treatment under general anesthesia does not take care of the disease, as it results in high recurrent caries rates as well as greater costs, both monetarily as well as possible long-term effects for children.

Children are not the only ones affected by caries and potential problems. The elderly, special-needs patients, rural communities, cancer patients, nursing home residents, people with diabetes, dry mouth sufferers, and people with little to no resources for seeing a dentist are at higher risk of poor outcomes. One thing that has been shown to change the caries rate is silver diamine fluoride (SDF). SDF implementation to arrest caries infection has been used around the world for over 50 years, yet we are still too slow, and for some people, too late to adapt and implement. Not only can we utilize the combination of silver diamine fluoride and glass ionomer cements for minimally invasive dental treatments, but we can now use SDF preventively in myriad ways. This informative course will prove to us that choosing silver diamine fluoride will not only stop decay but also prevent the infection in our most vulnerable patients.
